#### You can help to warm Ross this winter!

Last year, Ross-on-Wye Community Development Trust ran a very successful **Warm Ross** campaign to help households at risk of fuel poverty. Sadly, many households, including the elderly and those with children, face the dilemma of choosing between heating or eating. A magnificent response from the Ross public raised more than £4000, which was used to make emergency payments for meter top ups or food vouchers for households in need. Recipients were identified by trusted agencies such as the **Community Larder** or **GP surgeries** and were so grateful for the help.

We are running the appeal again this year so that we can continue this work. If you can afford to, please do consider making a donation to support households in Ross who are at

risk of fuel poverty. We are particularly grateful to those donors who have given Warm Ross the £250 **Winter Fuel Payments** they have received as a top up to their state pension, because they felt that they did not themselves need this extra support.

#### **New gates for walkers**

Ross Walkers are Welcome (RWaW) has been busy together with the Wye Valley National Landscape (formerly AONB) to improve footpath access locally - replacing stiles with gates — or gaps! Since April 2023, an impressive 40 new gates have been installed with another 35 planned for this winter. Installation has been done by EnviroAbility, Herefordshire Ramblers and a team of local volunteers, all supported by Herefordshire Council Public Rights of Way team.

If you fancy getting out and about this winter, why not try some of the fantastic new stile-free routes created, including:

- An 8.5 mile loop along the river and through farmland from Ross to Hole in the Wall & back, taking in parts of the Herefordshire Trail and Wye Valley Walk
- A 7 mile loop through woods and hills from Ross, over Penyard Hill to Weston-under-Penyard and back via Kingstone
- A 4 mile loop over Chase Hill and back through Cobrey & Hill Farms
- A short flat 2 mile walk from Ross through Marsh Farm & back along the Rudhall Brook.

#### **RVS ~ Ross Area Transport**


